Herschel's Notary Notes

The Library is proud to announce that it continues to offer notary services free of charge. The only thing charged is a smile of appreciation. But before you come in to get your documents notarized, there are several things to keep in mind.

First, while walk-ins are welcome, it is recommended that you call ahead as the Library only has a limited number of notaries. Also, make sure that nothing is signed until you appear before the notary; you may fill the form out beforehand, as long as it is not signed. You must bring a valid form of identification. If any witnesses are required for the documents, they must bring ID and sign in front of the notary.

It is important to note that the Library's notaries are not lawyers and cannot provide advice. Additionally, if the document is in Spanish, we have a translator available most of the time. For any other languages; however, an accepted translator must be present. Finally, when contacting the Library, please ask for Herschel or Tiffany if you have questions or concerns.

The Library is excited to offer this convenient service to its patrons and looks forward to helping you with your notary needs.

THE FLYING TIGERS

Perth Amboy's own Johnnie Petach, Jr. Flying Tiger & Naval Aviator American Volunteer Group 2nd Squadron Panda Bears

John E. Petach, Jr. was born July 15, 1918 during the closing months of WWI. He graduated from Perth Amboy High School in 1935 with honors. He loved music and was an accomplished singer. He sang in his church parish as a Cantor. In 1939 he completed his degree in chemical engineering from NYU. After graduation he applied to the U.S. Navy for admittance to the aviation program.

In 1937, Japan and China found themselves in an open war. Japan invaded China and China lost its eastern coastal areas. Japan could not occupy China, but its Imperial force inflicted heavy losses on China's armies and routinely bombed Chungking.

Claire Chennault, a retired veteran from the US Army Air Corp. He became a mercenary and was hired by Chaing Kai -Shek, generalissimo of China, to be Chief Air Adviser. Chennault canvassed the American aviation services for volunteers to fly to China thwart the Japanese aggression through China and to protect the Burma Road lifeline to China.

Officially known as the American Volunteer Group (AVG), the Flying Tigers were credited with destroying 29 planes and 1500 Japanese troops. The AVG lost nine men in battle. The planes were inferior dog fighters compared to maneuverable Japanese planes, but Chennault developed tactics to take advantage of the P40's heaviness and greater diving speed.

Johnnie Petach was an ace in the group. The US decided to assign a regular Air Force unit to China. Almost all of the original Flying Tigers returned home, but some were needed to stay and help the newly formed 23rd. Petach was ready to leave when he was asked to stay. On July 10, 1942, during what was to be his last mission, Petach went in on a dive bombing run when his plane was taken down, causing his sudden death. His bomb hit the target, but at the same instant his plane exploded having been hit by ground fire.




